Continuing his architectural education, Matthew achieved a distinction for his diploma in Architecture at Oxford Brookes University, 2006, before moving to Scotland at the end of 2006 to join Gaia Architects.

During his time at Brookes University, Matthew spent a year studying for his MSc on the Energy Efficient and Sustainable Building course, where he gaining greater awareness of sustainability issues and acquired a number of key principles for use in ecological architecture.

Matthew has gained experience from several architectural offices and a local planning authority. Whilst working for Gaia Matthew has had experience on a range of different projects, including the development of a zero-carbon housing scheme in Edinburgh, a passive standard healthy office and leisure complex in Alloa and the masterplan for a sustainable development at the Findhorn Community.

Matthew is currently involved in the development of a private house close to the village of Peebles. Set into the landscape, this project aims to utilize natural materials, including a Brettstapel massive timber kit from Austria and has been designed to meet the German PassivHaus standards.
